ICT/Art/DT (expressive arts/health & well-being) Research Totem poles and explain what they were used for. Design your own and present it anyway you’d like to.	Geography/ICT/History (humanities) Find out how many American Presidents there have been. Can you create a timeline to show when they were in Presidency. Pick one and create a fact file all about them.	DT/Literacy (science & technology) Plan a menu that you could serve on American Independence Day.	Numeracy Based on your menu plan for Independence Day workout how much it would cost to make this feast. You could use an online supermarket to locate and find out item prices.
Art/DT/Literacy (expressive arts/health & well-being) Create an advertisement to sell the cupboard that makes toys come to life in the story The Indian in the Cupboard by Lynne Reid Banks.	Literacy/music (expressive arts) Make a playlist of different American songs you could listen to on your road trip. Make sure you include songs from a range of genres, such as blues, jazz, country, rock, hip hop and rock and roll.	Art (expressive arts) Use a picture of a Native American Indian and see if you can sketch the image using pencil. Use shading to create effect.	Literacy/DT/Geography (humanities & science & technology) Look up and research the ‘Grand Canyon’. When you know what it is and how it was formed try and make a model of it using a range of materials.
Literacy/numeracy/science (s&t, health & well-being) Using the names of the American States make a word search.	Numeracy/DT (entrepreneurial skills) Help prepare a United States-themed evening meal by writing a shopping list for parents and carers. Report back to others using video or photographic evidence. What did you have to eat?	DCF/History/Literacy (humanities & science & technology) Use online sources to research and create a timeline of Native American history. Decide which events are most important, and write a caption to go with each date, explaining what happened	Free choice Design your own homework task relating to the topic and present in your own method.
