Feed

I have long poisonous tentacles which I use to catch my dinner.

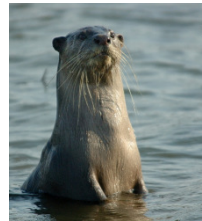
Jellyfish

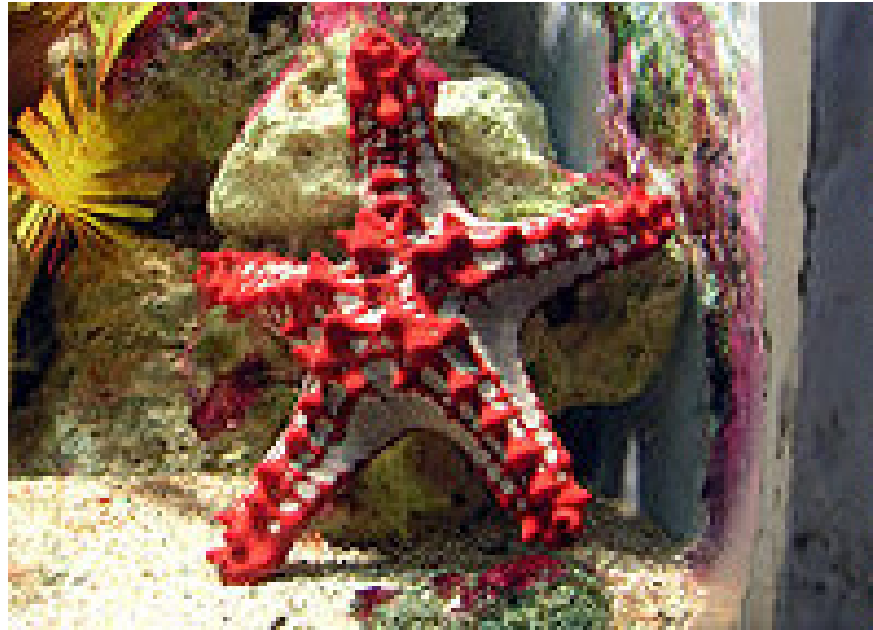
