As a school we have achieved our Platinum+ flag for Eco-Schools during the academic year 2017-18. We have also achieved 'Phase 6' of the Healthy schools scheme during the academic year 2018-19. We are now in the process of continuing our journey towards gaining 'The National Quality Achievement Award (NQA)' for Healthy Schools, Wales (currently only 11 primary schools in Swansea have this award). We feel this is of paramount importance especially given the raised status of health and well-being within the new curriculum 2022.

This is a reminder that children who have sandwiches are only to have water, weak squash or a carton of milk to drink. We hope you will also support us in encouraging the children to bring home their waste, so you can do your bit at home to recycle and also so you can monitor exactly what your child is eating.
